



We welcomed U.S Congressman Maxwell Frost; Amy Donley, PhD., Director – University of Central Florida Institute for Social and Behavioral Sciences Sean Snaith; PhD., Director – University of Central Florida Institute for Economic Forecasting; Oren J. Henry Director – City of Orlando Housing and Community Development Mitchell Glasser, Manager – Orange County Housing and Community Development and guests and community partners for our Pathway of Hope: Breaking the Cycle of Poverty Forum. Panelists brought unique perspectives on the issue of poverty and affordable housing.



In recent years Central Florida has found itself under the relentless grip of inflation, with the cost of living rising at a rate above the national average. Central Florida, once renowned for its affordability and economic opportunities, is grappling with the multifaceted challenges posed by soaring prices. This has resulted in increased cost of living and a hard impact on the housing market.

The panelists all agreed we have to look at ways of increasing the affordable housing units available in Central Florida. It will require a community approach of partnerships with government, the private sector, and nonprofits working together as we navigate through solutions resulting in breaking the cycle of poverty.


